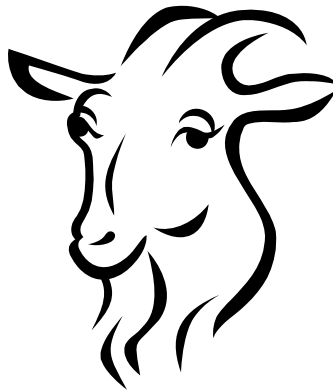

DIVISION 90--YOUNGER YOUTH SHOW

1. For children ages 4 years through 3rd grade.
2. One entry only per child.
3. Unregistered animals of any age, females and altered males only.
4. No premiums paid out.
5. Ribbons and prizes will be awarded.
6. Class will be judged on showmanship, not conformation of animal.
7. Animal must be kept at the fair grounds during the fair but may be housed with a sibling's 4-H club with the okay from the 4-H Leader and Open Class Livestock Superintendent.

All Dairy goat exhibitors will have their breed appropriate registration papers checked by the livestock superintendent or representative no later than 6:00 p.m. on Wednesday August 5, 2009

All Dairy goat exhibitors will be required to show proof of participation in the Scrapie program. All animals must have appropriate required Scrapie ID or registration Papers.

1. All milking Dairy goats must be milked out dry between 5:00 & 6:00 PM Thursday August 6, 2009, and checked by the livestock superintendent or representative.
2. Entries in the goat department will be limited to the capacity of the goat barn.
3. Each exhibitor/owner limited to two animals per class, please see exceptions in group classes.

4. Exhibit only animals will be allowed if space is available after all paid entries are housed. No exceptions.
5. Each exhibitor will be required to have a herd sign. Decoration is encouraged.
6. Pens must be cleaned and bedded daily. Exhibitors will be expected to make sure their animals have feed and water at all times and are encouraged to be in attendance during open fair hours.
7. No full body clipping allowed on the grounds. Touch ups and udder clipping will be allowed.
8. Only nursing bucks born after July 1, 2009 will be allowed at fair. Otherwise, no bucks are allowed.
9. No horns allowed on Dairy goats.
10. Any animal showing signs of illness or contagious diseases will not be allowed. In case of a dispute, a veterinarian will be called at the owner's expense.
11. All animals in group classes must be shown in individual classes.
12. Exhibitors will be required to wear appropriate, clean clothing in the show ring. No sandals, tank tops, tube tops, or shorts.

GROUP CLASSES:

337	Junior Get of Sire--Three does sired by same buck. One entry by same buck per exhibitor. Show name and number of sire on entry form.
338	Best Three Females--Any age. All bred and owned by exhibitor. Each exhibitor limited to one entry.
339	Senior Get of Sire--Three does sired by same buck. At Least one in milk. One entry by same buck per exhibitor. Show name and number of sire on entry form.
340	Produce of Dam--Two does produce of same dam. Show name and number of dam on entry form. One entry from same dam per exhibitor.
341	Dam and Daughter, owned by same exhibitor.
